Season Outlook

Miami ended their 2015 season with a heartbreaking loss in the NCFA Championship Game to Middle Georgia State, the 2nd time in the last 4 years they have ended their season that way. The Redhawks hope they can turn that sour taste into a sweet ending in 2016. They will enter the season as strong contenders to repeat as GLC champions and re-enter the NCFA playoffs, however to do so they will have to replace 2015 NCFA leading rusher Tyler Rus. Longtime Miami coaching stalwart Jay Fry Sr does return some firepower for the 2015 team in returning All-Americans Michael Christy, Jack Hannan and John Zuccaro. Miami is entering a few into the NCFA best nickname group with "Big Milk" Tom Radford, "Megatron" Colin Hogan and "Chef Shaw" Garrett Shaw. The Redhawks will look to Coach Joe Jackson's defense to hold things together until the offense can find its rhythm and hope that happens before some of their big GLC East clashes including the yearly tilt against their #1 rival Oakland University.

Although they will have to replace some major production on the defensive side of the ball with the departure of NCFA Defensive Player of the Year Jimmy Neyhouse and 2015 All-American LB John Phillipe they do return 2015 NCFA All-American QB Forrest Cordova. The defense will look to LB Tyler Godsey and a lot of new faces to keep the pressure on opposing GLC offenses but it will be the Raider offense that will be the catalyst to make them contenders in the GLC. The offense will be focused on the strong arm of Cordova and his connection with top receivers Drew Danner and Lawrence Yahle. If the Raider OL can stay healthy and give those guys the time they need Wright State could feature on of the most explosive offenses in the NCFA.

Season Outlook

Season Outlook

The Spartans came into the NCFA and the Great Lakes Conference with a bang in their inaugural season, knocking off GLC heavy hitters Oakland and Wright State before losing to GLC Champion Miami in their last game. Head Coach Chris Pickney brings back a good core and expects to be a contender for the NCFA Title in 2016. QB Vinny Costanzo and WR Jake Sterling look to reignite their connection which was among the NCFA bests before being derailed by injuries while Lucas Mayo and Pat Lowen will be laying the wood for the Spartan defense. With a nice group of new addition mixed in with their returning players expect Michigan State to be in the mix with the wide open GLC West. Season Outlook

The 2015 RMU squad entered the season with a new coach and a lot of new players facing a steep learning curve, the beginning of the season showed that with a pile of losses to some stiff non NCFA competition. However those early season losses allowed the team to gel and there were able to put it all together defeating rival UW-Milwaukee on a last second touchdown pass to secure the GLC West title and nearly knocking off undefeated Miami for the full GLC crown. This season they again have some new faces but Coach Carson and his staff are back in the fold, have recruited some very talented new players, and will look to the leadership of returning players to stay near the top of the GLC and compete for the NCFA playoffs. Returning team captain Kyle McKenna will again be a force on both sides of the ball as will Johnathon Maebane. Dynamic receiver Dushon Morris looks to come back from an injury plagued 2015 season to once again ascend to his position among the best in the NCFA. If the new players such as QB Roderick Taylor can pick up the systems early they could be among the NCFA's best this fall.

Season Outlook

UWM was expecting a rebuilding year in 2015 after having to replace a strong senior class from 2014 including former NCFA Offensive Player of the Year Sam Clark, however stellar defense early on led to



some big wins and they were in the thick of the GLC championship contention at the end. If not for a last second heave from Robert Morris they would have ended up in the GLC Title game last fall. The good news for the Panthers is that they return 19 of 22 starters and despite a very tough schedule they should once again be in contention for the GLC crown and the NCFA playoffs. UWM has lost 4 games combined the last two regular seasons, all to Robert Morris and Oakland and all by less than a touchdown. Leading the way for them to change those outcomes are 5 returning All-Americans including safety Tony Sanicola who proved to be force all over the field in 2015. The offense will center on QB Jordan Platek who should be near the league leaders for passing in his 2nd season at the helm of the high flying UWM attack. However for the 2nd straight season the Panthers will be looking for a receiver to step up and replace the previous year's NCFA leading receiver, as Matt Fix has left to run NCAA D2 track at UW-Parkside. Look for returning starters Kyle Wirtz and Brandon Smith to fill that void.
