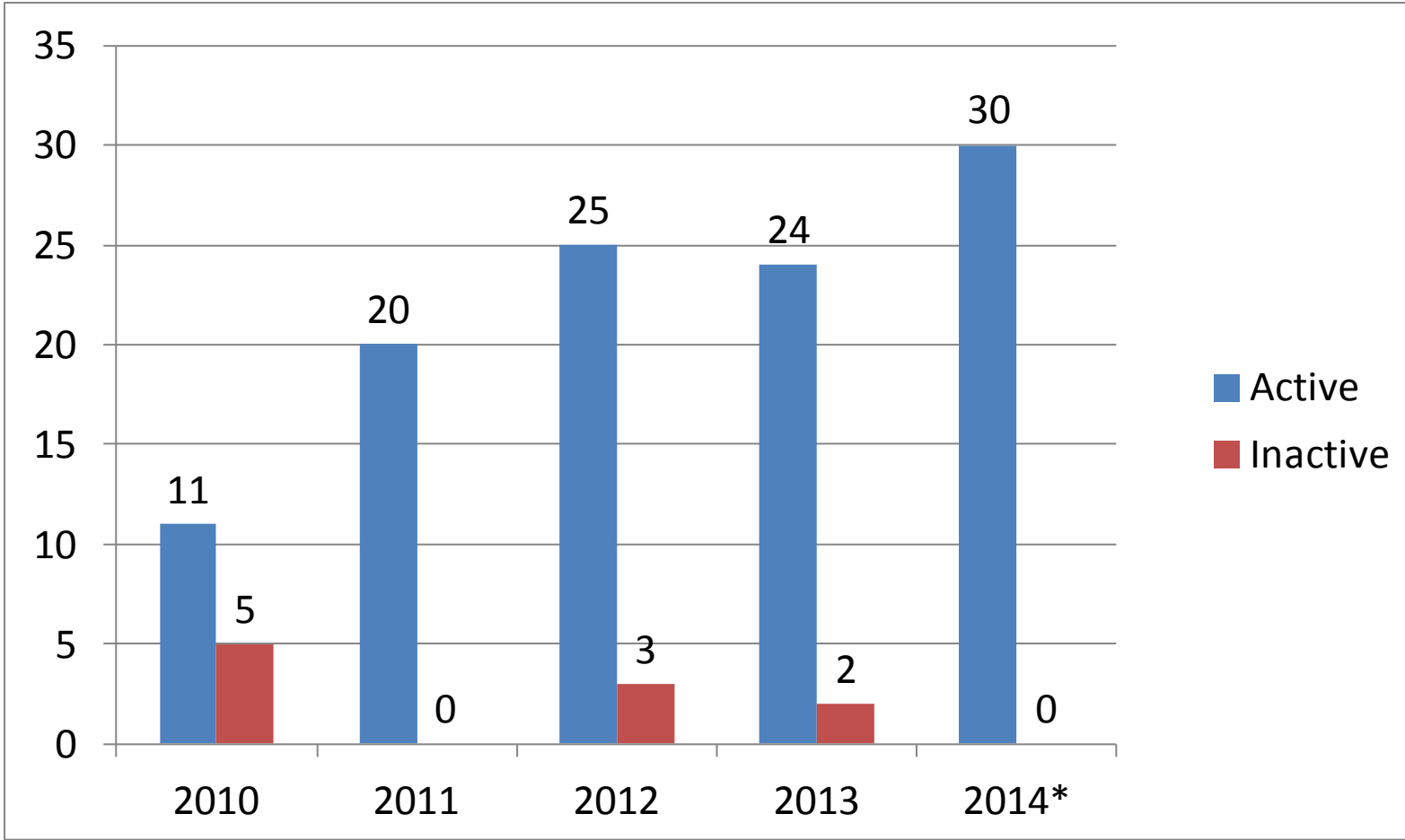

2013 Rules

- The 2013 NCFA League Meeting brought about a series of changes to the NCFA Rule Book
 - All NCFA member teams in attendance were given the opportunity to propose and debate desired rule changes
 - The NCFA Front office created a voting ballot for teams to vote FOR or AGAINST proposed rule changes following the meeting
 - All NCFA member teams were given the opportunity to cast a vote on each proposed rule change via email
 - The results of these votes altered the 2012 NCFA Rules, thus creating the 2013 NCFA Official Rules.



Rules – Major Changes

- Player Eligibility:
 - Lowered the limit of faculty and/or staff allowed on the roster from 5 to 3
- Field Requirements:
 - Deemed Highschool goal posts legal though NCAA goal posts recommended
- Conference Championships:
 - Changed the vote for conference championship games from unanimous vote to a majority vote



Rules – Major Changes

Discipline:

- Any team who forfeits a conference game becomes ineligible for the conference title or to participate in the conference or national title game
- Players/Coaches on a team placed on probation become ineligible for awards such as player of the week or All American



General Liability Insurance

(Optional - \$425)

- \$2,000,000 General Aggregate
- \$1,000,000 Per Occurrence
- Policy covers the NCFA and its members (The Teams)
- Covers many aspects of NCFA play (i.e. Travel, Practice, Workouts, Games)
- Full Year of Coverage
- This policy assists teams in obtaining playing fields
- 3rd Parties could be additionally insured for \$75
- This policy helped protect the NCFA and its members from potential financial losses from lawsuits
 - This is NOT a health or accident insurance policy



Regular Season

- 4 Conferences plus Independents
 - North Atlantic – Onondaga, Vermont, ECSU
 - Mid-Atlantic – Coppin, George Mason, Longwood, UMES, Radford
 - South Atlantic – OC TECH, SC, Middle GA State, Columbus State
 - Great Lakes West – SIUE, UW-Parkside, UW-Milwaukee, RMU-Peoria, Loyola-Chicago
 - Great Lakes East – Miami, UM-Flint, Oakland, Wright State, OSU
 - Independents – Rollins, Holland, Texas State, Alabama
- Each team played each conference opponent at least once
- Each team then supplemented their schedule with non-conference games



Regular Season

- Every Sunday night, teams were to complete a weekly team submission form and emailed it to their conference coordinator reporting their scores, results, and Off/Def Player of the Week nominations from the previous week
 - ***Needs Improvement!**
- Every Monday, Conference Coordinators updated scores/results on the NCFA website and selected Conference Off/Def Players of the Week
- Every Tuesday, NCFA President selected the National Off/Def Players of the Week, and coaches submitted coaches poll ballots.
- Every Wednesday, Rawlings Power Rankings released

The Morgantown Showdown

- Neutral site day of NCFA non-conference football games
- Ohio State, Coppin State, Wright State, Longwood, George Mason, and Rollins participated
- Held at Morgantown, WV's Mylan Park Sept 21, 2013.





The Morgantown Showdown

- Goal:
 - Provide an opportunity to for teams to play competition from outside their conference
 - Geographical Central location to facilitate travel for may teams
 - A day full of NCFA club football where teams could scout one another and see what competition in other conferences looks like
- Event was a huge success for a 1st year event.
- Areas of improvement:
 - Less Confusing playing surface
 - Yardage markers
 - Expand to 8 teams
 - Better weather (pouring down rain last year)
 - Improved locker room facilities



Conference Championships

- South Atlantic and Mid Atlantic voted play an end of the year Conference Championship Game
- Great Lakes automatically played a Conference Championship Game due to split of East vs West
- North Atlantic voted to let the regular season crown their conference champion.
- Conference Champions –
 - North Atlantic – Vermont (2-0, 5-3)
 - Mid-Atlantic – Coppin State (4-0, 9-2)
 - South Atlantic – Middle Georgia State (3-0 , 11-1)
 - Great Lakes – RMU-Peoria (4-0 , 7-1)
- All Conference Champions received a Conference Championship Trophy.



Rawlings Power Rankings

- During the season, scores were submitted each Sunday and the NCFA website was updated with results every Monday.
- Every Tuesday, Coaches submitted a new weekly Top 10 Poll ballot. ***NEEDS IMPROVEMENT**
- Beginning after week 4, every Wednesday, a new NCFA Rawlings Power Rankings was released.
 - 25% weight on the NCFA Coaches Poll Ranking
 - 25% weight on each team's Conf Win % Ranking
 - * Independent teams automatically inherited a Conf Win % equal to their Overall Win %
 - 25% weight on each team's Overall Win % Ranking
 - 25% weight on each team's Total Games Played Ranking

- Could expand from 4 to possibly 7 teams if Kennesaw State joins and Rollins and/or Alabama move from Independent to the SAC



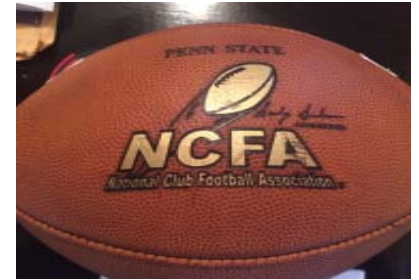

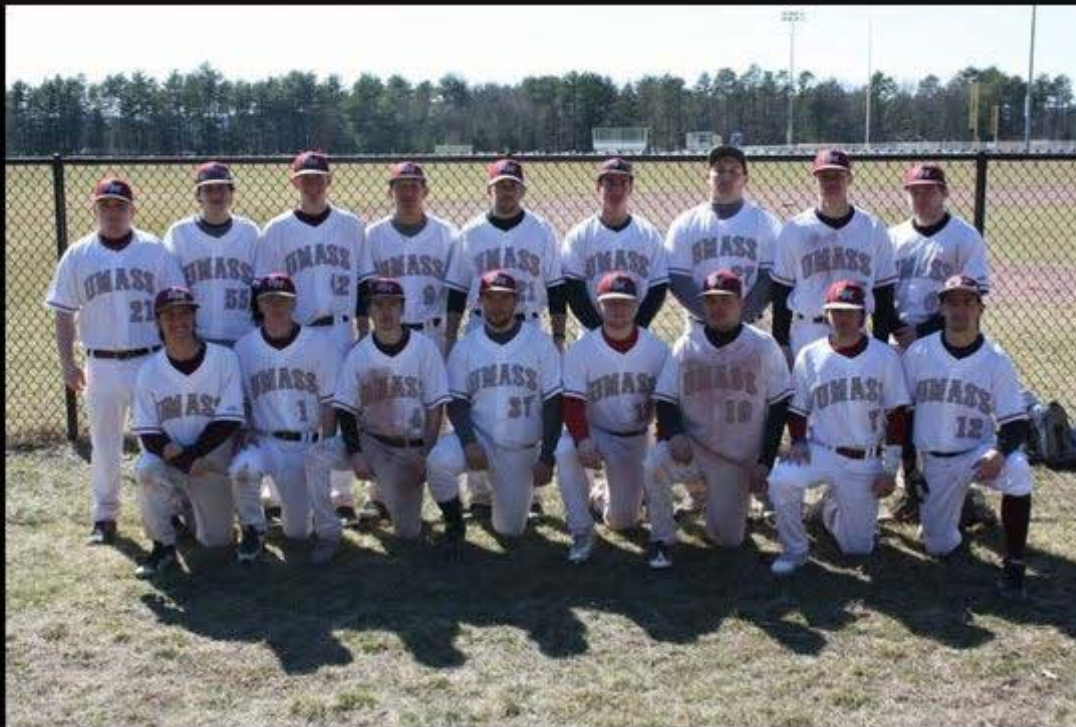

Voting Ballot Procedures

- Issues addressed one at a time
- Open forum to create the ballot
- Ballots will be emailed out in 1 Week
- Each team gets to submit 1 Voting Ballot
- Voting Results Released in Approx 2 Weeks



Issues

● Faculty & Staff Eligibility

- NCFA Rule - 6.05.1 No more than 3 total faculty, staff, or employees of the College/University may be added to a team's roster in a single NCFA season.
 - NCFA is concerned that the limit on the number of faculty, staff, and employees that can be added to a team's roster should be lowered in order to keep the nature of teams and leagues about college students playing intercollegiate football.
 - NCFA Recommendation is to limit the roster to a maximum of 1 total faculty, staff, or employees.



Issues

- Roster Violations – Specific ZERO roster
 - NCFA has not taken disciplinary action against a team for competing with zero players on the roster unless a protest was submitted by the offended team.
 - Should NCFA continue with this practice or issue a forfeit automatically if a team plays with ZERO roster?
 - NCFA concerns about too many games being played with ZERO roster at start of the season and thus could end up handing out tons of forfeits early.
 - What if neither team has a roster?
 - Declare the game exhibition or let score stand?
 - If a conf game and declared exhibition, it will have to be rescheduled to maintain conference schedule equality



Issues

● Start of NCFA Season

● Currently the NCFA season begins Sept 1

- This means any game played before Sept 1 is automatically considered exhibition and any game played after counts.
- Should start of NCFA season be moved back to either Labor Day or the Monday after Labor Day?
 - Delaying start will enable front office more time to prepare for the start of the season.
 - No team played during week 1 anyhow.
 - Teams still could play before the start of the season but they'd be deemed exhibition.
 - Delaying the start of the season will even the playing field in terms of total number of games played for those teams who return to school later and can't play the first 2 weeks of the season.



Issues

● Improving Communication

- It is like pulling teeth to get teams to report scores, especially if they lose
 - Recommend assigning a freshman the responsibility of reporting the score to the conf coordinator as soon as the game is over
- Very few teams are nominating players of the week
 - Teams are missing a great opportunity for individuals to get recognition
 - Recommend assigning a freshman the responsibility to get the nominations from coach and gather some game statistics to submit to the conference coordinator
- Keeping the NCFA website up to date and accurate with scores and content drives the public image of the league
- Other ideas?



Issues

🏈 Detering Forfeits

- 🏈 The #1 problem during the 20132 NCFA season was definitely teams forfeiting/canceling games. (Note: Cancel = Forfeit)
 - 🏈 #1 problem with forfeiting is that you're denying your opponent the opportunity to play the game of football.
 - 🏈 #2 problem is that when the forfeit occurs at the 11th hour, chances are the victim of the forfeit is going to be out significant amounts of time, effort, and money.
- 🏈 Currently our only discipline for forfeiting is:
 - 🏈 Teams are automatically placed on probation if they forfeit with less than 6 days notice.
 - 🏈 Teams can be placed on probation if they forfeit 2 or more conference games in a season.
 - 🏈 Teams who forfeit a conference game automatically become ineligible to participate in any Conference or National Championship Game or be crowned those titles.



Issues

🏈 Detering Forfeits

🏈 NCFA Suggests:

- 🏈 Install a financial penalty where if a team forfeits with less than 6 days notice, they are responsible for any costs that the team forfeited to incurs. (i.e.. Field Rental, Officials, or Travel/Lodging Costs if it's the home team that's forfeiting.)



Issues

Coaches Poll – NCFA Power Rankings

- The NCFA was pleased with how the Power Rankings worked to position the #1 and #2 team in the National Championship Game.
- However since 25% of the Power Rankings are based off of the Coaches Poll, the Power Rankings are very volatile due to lack of consistent voting by the coaches.
- 26 Coaches started the season voting, if a coach failed to submit a ballot two weeks in a row they were removed from voting eligibility. Only 13 coaches finished the season voting (50%). Only 7 of those submitted a ballot every week
 - NCFA Recommendation is to replace the coaches poll with a preselected panel by the NCFA made up of consistent coaches/officers (Past & Present), conference coordinators, and league alumni.



Issues

🏈 2015 Playoffs

- 🏈 It is the goal of the NCFA to move to a playoff structure leading to the National Championship Bowl Game as the culmination of the season.
- 🏈 In order to best position ourselves for a playoff system, we need to begin working to get all teams in conferences and thus eliminating Independent Teams.
- 🏈 Essentially Conference Championship Games will eventually serve as the first round of the playoffs.
- 🏈 Should plans for playoffs be pushed back to begin in 2016 to allow more time for the league to grow further?
- 🏈 When playoffs are incorporated, should match ups be based on geography or seeding?
