2010 NCBA RULES COMMITTEE MEETING

On July 17th, 2010, the NCBA will hold its 4th annual Rules Committee Meeting. The rules committee is comprised of a total of 11 NCBA representatives; eight of which are the NCBA's Division I Regional Directors plus the Division I and Division II Rules Committee Representatives. President of the NCBA, Sandy Sanderson rounds out the 11 representatives who will cast votes on different rule changes/modifications that NCBA member teams come up with.

All NCBA member teams are encouraged to voice their opinions on rules that they would like to see the NCBA adopt, change or modify in regards to rules. Teams can submit their opinion to their designated regional director or to one of the two NCBA rules committee representatives.

The NCBA's Division I Rules Committee Representative is Joe Kooping. All Division I teams can submit their comments to Joe at koopjgd20@alumni.uw.edu. Division II teams can submit their comments to Rich Fiore at

rfiore2@pride.hofstra.edu.

The meetings main goal is to give the NCBA member teams a voice in how the rules are structured. Last year, many rules were modified, changed or added. Some major rule changes added to the rulebook last year were rule 5.02.2 which states, "Any team found playing any NCBA Sanctioned Baseball Game with zero players on their eligible roster will automatically be forced to forfeit any victories achieved while having no eligible roster." This rule was added to encourage all NCBA teams to submit their paperwork well in advance of their first scheduled game. Additionally, according to rules 5.02.2.1 and 5.02.2.2, in this situation, the team without a roster would automatically be placed on probation and player statistics from the games played do not count for either team.

Rule 6.09.0 was re-worded to state that "For a player to participate in the NCBA using a fifth year of eligibility, that player must not have exhausted four years of eligibility at the Varsity Level." In

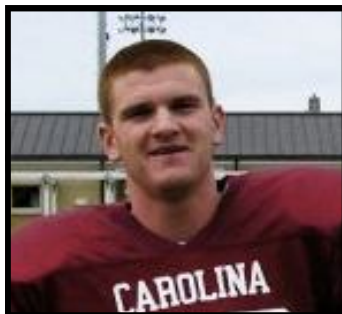

previous years, this rule had stated "...that player is required to have used his fourth year of eligibility at the Club Baseball Level.

All teams should have received an email from one or more of the following Rules Committee Representatives to submit any questions, comments or concerns regarding the NCBA Rulebook. Possible rule changes will be voted on by the Rules Committee where majority will either pass or veto a suggested rule.

Meeting details with vote counts as well as the updated 2011 NCBA rules will be sent out to each team soon after the conclusion of the meeting.

HARP NAMED DIRECTOR OF SOFTBALL TEAM DEVELOPMENT



Savannah Harp was just promoted, becoming the NCSA's Director of Team Development this past month.

This past month, CollClubSports employee Savannah Harp received a promotion when she was named the Director of Softball Team Development for the NCSA. Savannah will now be in charge of assisting in the development and recruitment of new club softball teams to become NCSA members.

"I am really excited about this opportunity," Savannah said. "I think there is so much potential for growth within the NCSA, and I look forward to turning that potential into a reality."

"I am extremely excited about her new role within the NCSA," said CollClubSports CEO Sandy Sanderson. "I am confident she will have a direct impact on substantially increasing the number of NCSA member teams as we move forward."

Harp is off to a great start in her new role, with

eight new teams already signed up for the 2011 NCSA season. These new teams include Michigan State, George Washington, Cornell, Loyola-Chicago, Eastern Washington, Rowan, Baylor, and Indiana – South Bend.

In addition to the eight teams that have already signed, there are six other teams that have verbally committed to joining the NCSA for 2011. These schools include Sacred Heart, Northeastern, Embry-Riddle, Iowa, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and Grand Valley State.

While she takes on her new role with the NCSA, Harp will remain the CCS Director of Spring Training Operations. The duties of the day-to-day league operations of the NCSA such as the hosting of the NCSA World Series will be handled by NCSA President Sandy Sanderson.

FROM THE NCBA TO THE PROS

Two former NCBA players were drafted last month in the 2010 MLB Draft, and a third signed as a free agent shortly after.

Former NCBA All-American/University of Florida Clubber turned Varsity pitcher Matt Campbell was drafted in the 42nd round by the Cincinnati Reds. Three rounds later, in the 45th round, University of Southern California

pitcher Vinnie St. John was drafted by the Angels. St. John is just the second player ever to be selected in the MLB Draft straight out of the NCBA. Nate Nowicki, a pitcher for Colorado State University was the first in 2003. Dan Gentzler, who had pitched for the University of Maryland's Club Team before making their varsity team was signed as a free agent

by the Detroit Tigers and is currently with the Connecticut Tigers in the New York/Penn League.

Steve Schmoll, a former University of Maryland Clubber is the only former NCBA player to ever reach the Major Leagues. Schmoll made his Major League debut on April 6, 2005 with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

NCFA SCHEDULES RELEASED

The NCFA's first full-season gets underway beginning September 1st with three South Atlantic Teams playing. South Carolina is set to host Fort Union Military Academy, Clemson is playing at home against Durham, and Radford is traveling to play Southern Virginia to open up the NCFA regular season. The NCFA season runs through the end of November with Week 11 being the final week. New NCFA member team, South Alabama closes out the NCFA season with a game at North Greenville. The second ever NCFA Conference game takes place during Week 3 where the University of Michigan-Flint hosts Wright State University. Another conference match-up to look out for is during Week 9 when Vermont hosts bitter-rival Maine in a

game which is sure to please.

For the 2010 season, there will not be any Championship Bowl Games, however a National Champion will be crowned. The 2010 National Champion will be crowned by holding the #1 spot in the final NCFA coaches pool. Each week, each team will get to submit one Coaches Poll Voting Ballot by which the NCFA teams will be ranked. At the end of the year the team who sits atop the final coaches poll will be crowned the National Champion. Starting in the 2011 season the NCFA will host a National Championship Game between the #1 and #2 teams in the final coaches poll in order to determine the National Champion.

www.ncfafootball.org. Once there, click on "Schedules" to see the complete list of games. With a lot of games going on each week, teams also have the ability to search by a specific week, conference or team in order to simplify their search.

The NCFA's first season is expected to be an exciting one, so be sure to check the NCFA website regularly to keep up to date on all things NCFA.
