Nicholas Ondrila: A True All American

Nicholas A. Ondrila a 2014 NCFCA Academic All America is more than just an All-American football player at Loyola University Chicago. Nicholas is currently an U.S. Army cadet in ROTC, and more specifically the cadet Battalion Commander of Loyola's program. This means Nicholas is the highest-ranking leader in the program who is responsible for everything the battalion does and fails to do; Nicholas is essentially the student CEO of the program. The Army ROTC (Reserve Officer Training Corps) program's purpose is to commission officers into the active duty Army, Army Reserves, and/or Army National Guard. Officers who commission through ROTC will receive the rank of Second Lieutenant, the lowest officer rank. Nicholas has been selected to go on active duty, which means that his full time job after graduation will be the Army. Prior to graduation Nicholas will receive orders to go to more advanced training in a course called BOLC, or Basic Officer Leaders Course. Depending on the job you were assigned you will go to one of the many Army installations around the country for BOLC. For Nicholas this will take me to Fort Benning, Georgia, where he will complete Infantry BOLC.

When asked about playing in the NCFCA Nicholas Ondrila stated, "Playing club football was one of the best decisions I made in college hands down. Getting a second opportunity to play football after high school was something that I thought was not possible until I found out that Loyola had started a club team back in 2012. The best thing about it being a "club" was that players were out there for the love of the game. There is no outside pressure because of scholarships or any other reason; people came out because they loved to play football or they wanted to learn to play the game that they watched every Friday, Saturday or Sunday. I made my best friends through Loyola's club football program; this sport does that to a group of people.. There was always a compromise though: I would have to miss one or two games due to mandatory ROTC field training. Those were the weekends that killed me the most, knowing that my brothers were out on the field without me playing by their side. When it comes down to it, I wanted to play the game I love, and all I did was made the time and sacrifice in my life so I could play football. When I think about it, why wouldn't you want to make the sacrifices so you could play again? I was able to play the best sport on the planet with the best group of guys I could ask to play with; it doesn't get any better than that."
